## **Fire**


Fire Size: 5485 Acres. Fire behavior was moderate yesterday, with minimal spread. Active fire behavior is expected in all areas of the fire today and tomorrow due to erratic and gusty winds and slightly above normal temperatures. Potential for thunderstorms in the forecast area in the early afternoon through late evening. Storms may be dry or a mix of dry and wet.

#### **Smoke**

All areas will see periods of haze but overall air quality should be GOOD in most areas with periods of MODERATE. Espanola down to Cochiti Lake area may see MODERATE to USG periods in the afternoon and evening. Areas close to the fire including Peralta Canyon, Paliza Canyon, and the hwy 4 corridor may see periods of USG.

## **Extended Forecast**

Thursday and Friday winds are expected to increase and could lead to near-critical fire weather conditions.
