Fire


Hermits Peak Fire ~ Calf Canyon Fire combined is currently at 303,341 acres with 34% containment.

Smoke

Moderate to strong transport winds out of the WSW are forecast to develop this afternoon across the outlook area. This will provide increased ventilation and better air quality for the communities in the outlook area today, except in locations immediately impacted by fire. The Mora and Rociada areas will experience Unhealthy to USG conditions early this morning, but should improve to Moderate by afternoon. Sapello shows Moderate AQ this morning, but will improve to Good by late morning. Las Vegas will experience Good AQ today. Taos and Angel Fire will experience Good AQ today, and the Cimarron-Philmont HQ area is forecast to be Good with possible periods of smoke later in the day.

Air Quality Alert

An Air Quality Alert continues for the region through 12 PM today. Counties in the outlook area include: Colfax, Mora, and San Miguel counties.
