Fire


Hermits Peak Fire \sim Calf Canyon Fire combined is currently at 303,341 acres with 40% containment.

Smoke

Strong transport winds out of the SW are forecast to develop this afternoon across the outlook area. This will increase ventilation across the outlook area, but communities immediately down wind of active fire locations will continue to experience Moderate with possible periods of USG smoke impacts. Communities along the west side of the Sangre de Cristos will experience Good AQ today. Model guidance indicates smoke pushing along the NM 518 corridor tonight into the Taos Valley and again tomorrow night as a back door cold crosses the region. Moderate AQ conditions should be anticipated during these periods. Winds are forecast to return to a more southwesterly direction by Sunday.

Air Quality Alert

An Air Quality Alert continues for the region through 12 PM today. Counties in the outlook area include: Colfax, Mora, and San Miguel counties.
