

Smoke Outlook New Mexico-Regional

Issued by Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program on June 04, 2022 at 07:03 AM MDT

6/04 - 6/05

Fire

Expect a warmer/hotter and significantly drier weather pattern this weekend across the outlook area. Transport winds from the west 15-25 mph this afternoon and broadly from the west-northwest at similar speeds on Sunday. This will result in elevated fire weather concerns for much of the area as hot, dry, and unstable conditions dominate. Locally critical fire weather conditions may develop in the northeast part of the area on Sunday where winds will be slightly more enhanced late in the weekend. The next significant backdoor cold front may impact the outlook area around the middle of next week.

Smoke

GOOD air quality expected across a vast majority of the outlook area through Sunday. Smoke from the Black fire will once again be transported nearly due east with increased haze/smoke aloft likely just south of Socorro toward Hatch and Radium Springs. Elsewhere, smoke impacts are not expected to be widespread or significant. However, haze will likely be more noticeable in the Las Cruces area on Sunday with haze increasing with eastward extent toward the southcentral mountains including Ruidoso and the U.S. 54 corridor between Alamogordo, Tularosa and Corona.
