| Current<br>Situation  | Yesterday, crews achieved 82 percent containment of the fire. Working in steep, rugged<br>country, firefighters made significant progress constructing fireline south of Soldier<br>Creek and continued to address a line of burning trees near Bald Mountain. Other crews<br>moved into suppression repair using specialized equipment, while a wildland fire<br>module patrolled and looked for heat in heavy timber on very steep slopes on the north<br>side of Sharp Mountain. Fire behavior has been limited to smoldering and creeping the<br>last few days.<br>Today, helicopters will shuttle some crews that have been camped out on the fireline<br>down to the valley for demobilization. A drawdown of resources is underway as<br>containment of the fire rapidly increases. Aviation resources will also continue backhaul<br>of equipment and resources.<br>As monsoonal moisture begins to move into southern Utah, the chance for significant<br>rain on the fire may begin to diminish. However, the warm dry weather in the area<br>tomorrow is expected to give way to potential thunderstorms in the late afternoon to |                       |
