

Fire


The Windigo Fire grew 6 acres Saturday and is at 1,052 acres with 15% containment. The Potter Fire grew 18 acres Saturday and is now at 185 acres with 0% containment. Weather conditions are favorable for increased fire behavior today, potentially escalating smoke production. For additional information, use the following links; Potter Fire and Windigo Fire.

Smoke

Smoke being generated by the Windigo and Potter fires, as well as the Cedar Creek fire to the north, will be mainly terrain driven today with downslope/downvalley winds early this morning, becoming upslope/updrainage by late morning through mid-afternoon. As the instability increases by midday, the smoke will be lifted and transported towards the north due to prevailing southerly winds throughout the vertical column above about 8000 ft MSL. Therefore, the bulk of the smoke will be dispersed northward away from Smoke Outlook sites between Crater Lake and Bend resulting in Good AQ. The two exceptions will be Crescent Lake and Oakridge where overall Moderate AQ is expected. A few hours of USG AQ is likely in the Oakridge area this morning and again late tonight. All other sites will continue to have Good AQ.
