## Fire

The Rum Creek Fire, located 5 miles northwest of Galice, OR is at 910 acres and burning through rugged terrain south of the Rogue River along the Lower Rogue Canyon. Warmer temperatures and increasing vertical mixing may result in increased fire behavior and more active fire on Thursday and Friday. Minimal new growth is expected but highly dependent on shifting weather conditions during the next 2-3 days. A cool down is expected Saturday and Sunday, dampening fire behavior and providing an opportunity for increased suppression efforts.

## **Smoke**

Expect increased smoke with warmer temperatures. Areas of concern are immediately east and south of the fire along Galice Road. Visible smoke will be seen along I-5. Prevailing winds out of the north will send smoke to the south toward Cave Junction. During the evening, smoke will pool along the Rogue River and settle into areas east and south of the fire perimeter, including Galice, Merlin, Grants Pass, and Medford. New smoke production will depend on fire behavior; however, overnight drainage smoke will continue to effect communities in the immediate vicinity of the fire and along the Rogue River. Heaviest impacted areas will be along Galice Road, such as Almeda Camp, Mark's Island, Rand Recreation Area, and Galice. Moderate smoke will impact Merlin, Grants Pass, Medford, and Ashland into the evening and overnight. These conditions should continue Thursday into Friday until a weather shift occurs Friday evening into Saturday morning.
