
Issued by Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program on August 30, 2022 at 07:11 AM MDT

Fire

The fire is currently at 12,078 acres with 28% containment along the northern and western perimeters. Today will be dry and very warm with slightly unstable conditions. Fire activity is expected to be active especially near Collier Peak along the southeastern part of the fire. Creeping and smoldering will continue along the east portion of the fire. Smoke

Smoke that has pooled overnight around Lake Cascade will slowly lift and gradually disperse in the afternoon with the development of terrain-driven winds. A well-defined plume from fire activity near Collier Peak should rise above the ridge top late in the day and be carried eastward by the upper-level winds. Smoke from smoldering will remain near ground-level in the vicinity of Lake Cascade. Air quality is predicted to average VERY UNHEALTHY in West Cascade, UNHEALTHY in South Cascade, and UNHEALTHY for SENSITIVE GROUPS (USG) in Cascade. Elsewhere, GOOD conditions with periods of MODERATE will occur in McCall, Donnelly, and Garden Valley.
