

Fire


The Double Creek fire is currently 147,582 acres and 15% containment. The Sturgill fire is currently 18,715 acres and 0%. The Nebo fire is currently 11,688 acres and 0%. Yesterday, fire growth was limited by a northerly wind. Today, south winds will allow for fire progression on the north and east sides of the fire. Fire activity will pickup today with short runs in fine fuels and an increase in singe and group torching.

Smoke

Overall, smoke from regional fires north of the forecast area will continue to affect forecast area. This area could see Unhealthy or Hazardous at times, closer to the Oregon/Idaho border. Locally, expect smoke production to increase in these areas on the north side of the fire. Winds will continue to push higher concentrations of smoke into Enterprise and Imnaha. La Grande and Baker City will see greater effects from regional fires today, expect to see periods of USG to these areas.
