# NE Oregon -- Double Creek, Sturgill, and Nebo Fires



#### Fire


The Double Creek fire is currently 157,088 acres and 22% containment. The Sturgill fire is currently 20,036 acres and 0%. The Nebo fire is currently 12,563 acres and 0%. Yesterday, fire growth was moderated by heavy localized rainfall. Most areas around the fire saw at least 0.7 inches of rain. Internal smoldering will be observed today in heavy down fuels.

## **Smoke**

Overall, smoke from regional fires southwest of the forecast area will continue to affect area. We are still seeing effects in the area from the western Oregon fires as a southwesterly flow continues to move east across the state. Expect to see the this effect today, with some relief from smoke impacts overall. Expect to see widespread improving of air quality over the area. Higher humidity in the state will limit fire spread throughout the region.
