

Fire


The Double Creek fire is currently 157,175 acres and 27% containment. The Sturgill fire is currently 20,036 acres and 0%. The Nebo fire is currently 12,563 acres and 0%. Overall, widespread precipitation over the area the past week has halted forward progression of the fires. Expect to see minimal fire activity on the fires.

Smoke

Overall, smoke impacts will be localized to the Imnaha River drainage. Statewide, regional fires are still producing smoke that will be seen as hazy conditions and smoke aloft. Expect to see widespread improving of air quality over most areas. Higher humidity and cooler temps in the state will limit fire spread throughout the region. Halfway and Riggins will continue to see MODERATE/USG impacts from the fire.
