Road Closures:

The Washington Department of Transportation's (WSDOT) geotechnical team was on site along the Highway 2 corridor felling fire weakened trees and clearing debris throughout the day. The assessment has been completed and they currently plan to open Highway 2 on Monday. Please check https://wsdot.com/travel/real-time/alerts/road/oo2 for the most current information.

Impacts are ongoing in communities adjacent to the fire. Highway 2 remains closed just east of Index Galena Road near Sunset Falls (MP 36), to the junction of 5th St. N into the town of Skykomish (MP 49). Local highway access is permitted for **residents with identification** from the west closure at Index-Galena Road to the Money Creek tunnel. Highway 2 from the west end of Money Creek Tunnel to 5th Street in Skykomish will remain closed to all.

We ask residents to please stay close to their own property and be mindful of the fire crews working along the highway. Please follow posted speed limits.

Update:

As anticipated, weather conditions led to increased fire activity on Wednesday. On the south side of the fire flames and smoke could be seen. These spot fires were started by roll outs, however the fire moved upslope and back to the main body of the fire. The spot fires remain within the containment lines and firefighters are closely monitoring. Due to the increased activity, night crews will be monitoring and patrolling for the next several days.

Today's weather will be mostly sunny with light winds west 5-10 MPH. Relative humidity's will remain in the mid 50's with maximum temps around 65 degrees.

Evacuation Levels: Current Evacuation levels:

- Level 1 (Ready): Index continues.
- No other evacuation guidance for occupied areas of Snohomish County.
- Level 2 (Set): Baring and Grotto and area along U.S. 2 east to the Money Creek tunnel. Continues.
- Level 3 (Go): From west side of Money Creek tunnel to milepost 48, plus FS Road 65 (Beckler River Road).
- Skykomish remains at Level 1 (Ready).

Please understand that while fire activity has slowed, the area remains hazardous.

Resources: 146 personnel – 1-type 2 initial attack hand crew, 2 hand crews, 9-engines, and 71 overhead.
