Road Closures:

Washington Department of Transportation (WSDOT) has completed felling operations along the Highway 2 corridor and currently plan to open the highway on Monday. We want to remind the public that firefighters are still operating along the side of the road. Please follow all posted speed limits and expect delays. At this time, Highway 2 remains closed just east of Index Galena Road near Sunset Falls (MP 36), to the junction of 5th St. N into the town of Skykomish (MP 49). Local highway access is permitted for **residents with identification** from the west closure at Index-Galena Road to the Money Creek tunnel. Highway 2 from the west end of Money Creek Tunnel to 5th Street in Skykomish remains closed to all.

Update:

Activity continues to be moderate on the east side of the fire near Skykomish. Firefighting tactics include monitoring for rollout and fire backing down steep hillsides to areas that are more accessible for firefighting operations. Crews are monitoring firelines and prepping structures to protect against rollout debris. The west side of the fire is backing down the mountain and working its way toward containment lines. Large fuels continue to burn and smolder within the control perimeter, making it more visible at night. A night shift patrol is in place to monitor this activity.

Today's weather will be partly sunny with light winds west 5-6 MPH. Relative humidity's will remain in the mid 60's with maximum temps around 65 degrees.

Evacuation Levels: Current Evacuation levels:

- Level 1 (Ready): Index continues.
- No other evacuation guidance for occupied areas of Snohomish County.
- Level 2 (Set): Baring and Grotto and area along U.S. 2 east to the Money Creek tunnel. Continues.
- Level 3 (Go): From west side of Money Creek tunnel to milepost 48, plus FS Road 65 (Beckler River Road).
- Skykomish remains at Level 1 (Ready).

Please understand that while fire activity has slowed, the area remains hazardous.
