## Fire


The Cedar Creek Fire in Central Oregon is now 113,809 acres with 172 acres of growth and 17% containment. Fire activity is expected to be minimal today into tomorrow but continued warming and drying throughout the day may increase fire activity. This trend is expected to continue in the coming days.

## **Smoke**


Oakridge will continue to have the greatest impacts today. Hazardous air quality in Oakridge this morning will improve to USG as skies clear throughout the day but expect to see Hazardous air quality again by tomorrow morning. Winds out of the west are now pushing smoke to the east and southeast of the fire, including Bend, La Pine, and Crescent Lake. This will continue into Saturday where we expect to see Moderate to USG air quality. Eugene/Springfield should experience Good air quality throughout today and into Saturday.
