## Fire

The Cedar Creek Fire in Central Oregon is now 114,104 acres with a small amount of overnight growth and 20% containment. Continued lower humidity and warmer temperatures could lead to increased fire activity, particularly in the western half of the fire. These conditions are expected to continue into early next week.

## **Smoke**


Oakridge will continue to have the greatest impacts today with Very Unhealthy air quality this morning improving to USG by overnight. Smoke impacts are slightly more elevated at areas north of Highway 58. Tomorrow, we expect Hazardous air quality in the morning and an improving trend during the day. Lowell has Unhealthy air quality this morning but should similarly improve throughout the day. Bend, La Pine, Crescent Lake and Silver Lake can expect to see smoke impacts, but the air quality levels are not expected to exceed Moderate/USG. Eugene/Springfield may see possible periods of light smoke this morning/afternoon.
