

Showers and Storms Return Thursday into the Weekend

Welcome to the Summer Solstice! Somehow, it is almost July. Hard to adjust to summer forecasting when it has felt like March the past couple of days! General troughiness returns across the West bringing afternoon and evening thunderstorms and showers along with it. This resurgence of storm activity won't be as widespread or wet as the last round we had a couple of weeks ago, but have a lightning plan in mind if you plan on being outdoors the rest of the week. Temperatures will be on an upward trend as well, but will still be below normal for late June.

CHANGES FROM PREVIOUS BRIEFING

DETAILS

- A Steady Warm-Up: A slow start to summer continues, at least temperature-wise. While steady warming is expected this week, highs will remain near to below season averages.
- Showers & T-storms Chances Return: An incoming weak low pressure system will reintroduce chances for showers & isolated t-storms late Thursday into Friday. Shower and storm activity could persist well into the night. Shower and storm chances could stick around through early next week. Breezy winds from the NE to NW late Thursday into Friday.
- Snowmelt River Flooding: While our recent cool weather has tempered flows over the last few days, expect high
 flows from snowmelt to continue across Eastern Sierra streams and flooding on the Walker River, until further
 notice.
