Fire

The fire continues to stay south of Forest Road 12 and north of Forest Road 14 and is reported to be 1969 acres. Today, fire behavior will be moderated by the cool and moist weather conditions. However, the heavy duff layer, timber litter and dead logs will continue to smolder within the fire perimeter. Favorable weather conditions yesterday allowed firefighters to conduct some firing operations along the north edge and plan to continue today if conditions allow.

Smoke

The cool and moist weather will continue this morning. The expected persistent burning in logs and deep duff will smolder and produce smoke throughout the day. These conditions will lead to GOOD air quality across the forecast area for most of the day. Clouds may clear this afternoon allowing smoke to lift out of the fire area. West winds today could bring smoke into Government Camp in the afternoon and overnight.
