Northwest California-Interior Happy Camp Complex

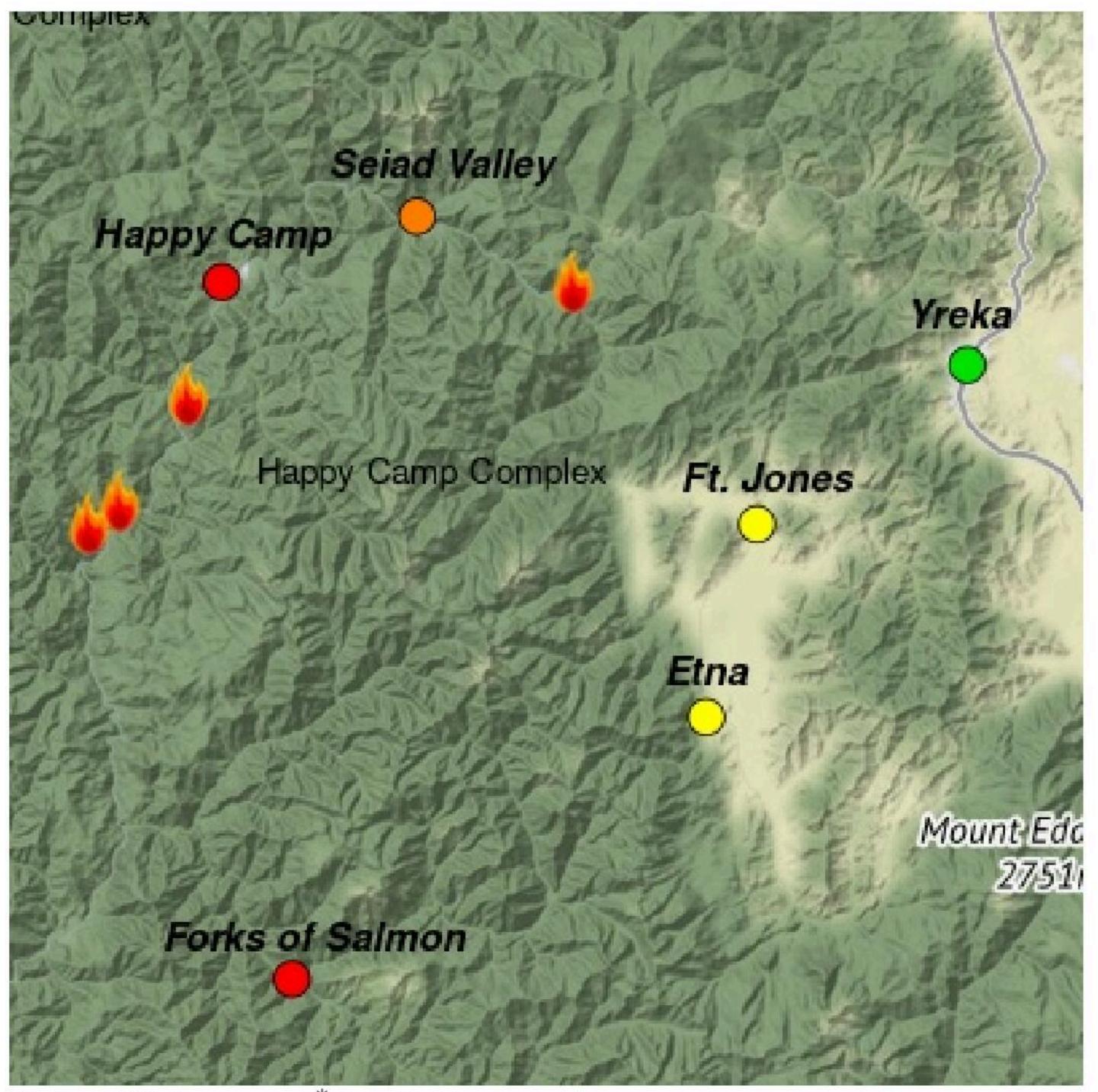

Fire

The Happy Camp Complex saw very little growth since yesterday and is at 31,141 acres (yesterday was 31,032 acres) with containment remaining at 57%. Yesterday, crews monitored the perimeter and put some fire on the ground to help secure containment lines, and they are closely monitoring the south end of the UFish Fire near Titus Creek. With hot, dry conditions, they are keeping watch for new ignitions and there is a slight chance of dry thunderstorms this weekend in our area. Smoke

Much of the area around the Happy Camp Complex was clear yesterday, but with multiple fires in the region, additional smoke reached the Klamath River along the Highway 96 corridor up to Happy Camp, and along the Salmon River reaching Forks of Salmon. Currently, there is little to no winds over the fire but that will change in the afternoon with a light West-Northwest which will may bring more smoke over our area and will likely settle overnight by the terrain driven winds.
