Umpqua SW Oregon Anvil, Umpqua NF Fires

Issued by Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program on September 18, 2023 at 06:27 AM PDT

9/18 - 9/19

Fire

Active burning on Anvil fire continued, with the fire expanding to nearly 9000 acres and zero containment. Much of the fire is at a dry elevation above the moist marine layer. Grizzly and Chilcoot fires exhibited spots of low intensity burning during Sunday. A weather change, with cooler conditions should reduce smoke for most of the areas north and east of the Anvil Fire this week. Smoke

The active Anvil Fire continues to produce significant smoke across far southwest Oregon. Winds are pulling the smoke south along the coast and to some degree inland. Smoke is mixing with fog and does not readily disburse well into the day. Most impacted communities will be Agness, communities along the Rogue River, and the Gold Beach area. Good AQ will prevail for the I-5 corridor and Umpqua NF. Monitor air quality by visiting the Fire and Smoke Map.

Roadway Visibility

The mixture of moderate to heavy smoke and marine fog will lead to very low visibility, particularly along the US Highway 101 corridor from just south of Port Orford to the Gold Beach access. Motorists should allow for sudden reduced visibility to as low as a quarter mile or less at times through mid- afternoon.
