West-Central Oregon - Lookout and Bedrock Fire

Fire

With cloudy skies and cooler temperatures, fire activity is expected to be minimal at the Lookout Fire, which has had very limited growth last several days. It's currently at 24,518 acres with an increase to 50% containment. No more growth is expected on the Bedrock Fire at 31,590 acres and 90% containment. Smoke

A similar pattern will continue today and for the next couple days, with limited smoke production from the Lookout Fire, with the most significant impacts occurring in areas near the fire. Smoke will continue to pool overnight in low lying areas near the fire gradually increasing until the inversion breaks. McKenzie will have MODERATE conditions increasing to USG midday before the smoke clears, as will other communities along HWY 126 near the fire. Areas in the Willamette Valley (Eugene & Cottage Grove) and in the Cascades not in the McKenzie River drainage (Detroit Lake, Sweet Home, & Oakridge) will see GOOD conditions. As the smoke lifts, light west winds will again push smoke over the crest impacting communities east of the Cascades with periods of MODERATE.
