Fire

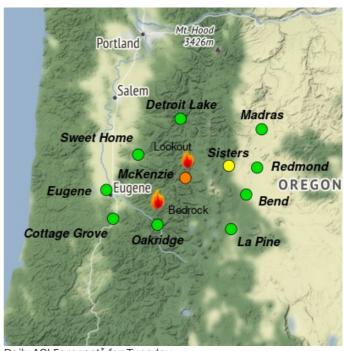
Slightly increased fire activity on the Lookout Fire is expected today with higher winds and clearer skies than yesterday. Minimal growth is expected again with the fire only adding less than 50 acres yesterday, which now is 24,548 acres with 50% containment. Smoke

Today will be like yesterday's forecast, as weak on shore flow continues to clear the Willamette Valley of smoke. Areas near the Lookout Fire in the McKenzie River valley will have the greatest impacts, until the inversion lifts midday. As the smoke lifts, expect winds to push the smoke over the Cascades, as it has done the last several days, impacting those communities east of the divide late afternoon.
