Fire

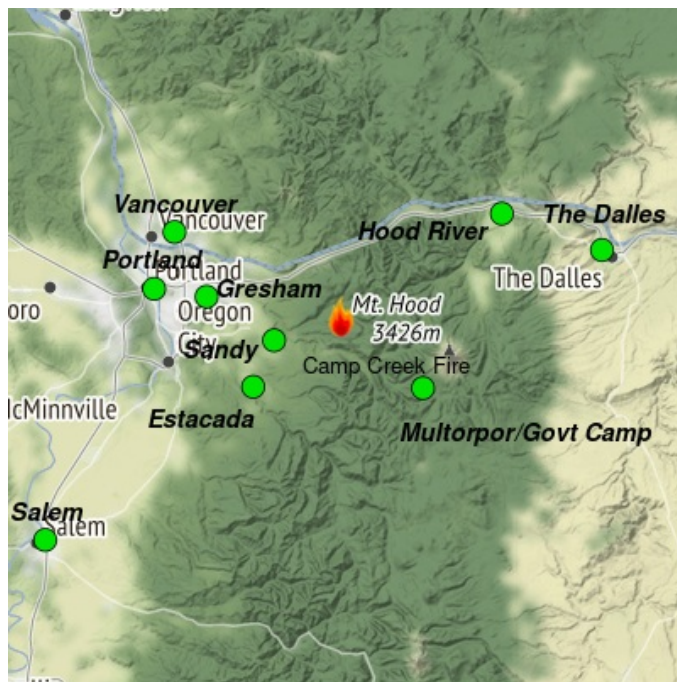
The Camp Creek fire is reported at 2,023 acres with 35% containment. Crews continue to make progress containing the fire by using firing operations to secure firelines.

Smoke

Expect similar smoke conditions today and tomorrow compared to the past several days. Smoke dispersion patterns will remain the same, with light west winds bringing light smoke eastward during the afternoon and evening, and down-slope winds bringing smoke towards East Portland at night and clearing out late morning. However, cloud cover may weaken the down-slope winds that have been occurring at night, so smoke impacts in the Portland area may be less than the past few days.

Transportation

Patchy fog is in the forecast for tomorrow morning. Be especially alert while driving in fog-prone areas near the fire, as fog and smoke can combine to create very low visibility.
