Umpqua SW Oregon Tyee Ridge, Chilcoot, Ridge, and Grizzly Fires

Fire

The Anvil, Grizzly, Brice Creek, Chilcoot fires exhibited some active burning during Saturday. Weather conditions kept smoke in many areas of Southwest Oregon with only slow clearing in the afternoon. Reduced AQ will continue mainly in proximity and south of the Anvil, Tyee Ridge and Chilcoot fires. Dry conditions will continue early week, which could lead to further fire and smoke potential for the region. Smoke

Very light drainage winds will become North this afternoon, leading to light smoke or haze for Garden Valley, Roseburg, and the I-5 corridor of Douglas County. Heaviest smoke impacts will occur along the US 101 corridor, just south of Port Orford to the Gold Beach access. Additional heavy smoky will continue over the Rogue Valley to Agness well into the day. Across eastern Douglas county periods of MODERATE this morning should become GOOD, as drainage smoke mixes out by early afternoon. Monitor air quality by visiting the Fire and Smoke Map.

Roadway Visibility

The mixture of moderate to heavy smoke and marine fog will lead to very low visibility, particularly along the US Highway 101 corridor from just south of Port Orford to the Gold Beach access. Motorists should allow for sudden reduced visibility to as low as a quarter mile or less at times through early afternoon.
