



# Smoke Outlook

## North Central OR/WA Camp Creek

9/07 - 9/08

Issued by Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program on September 07, 2023 at 07:51 AM PDT

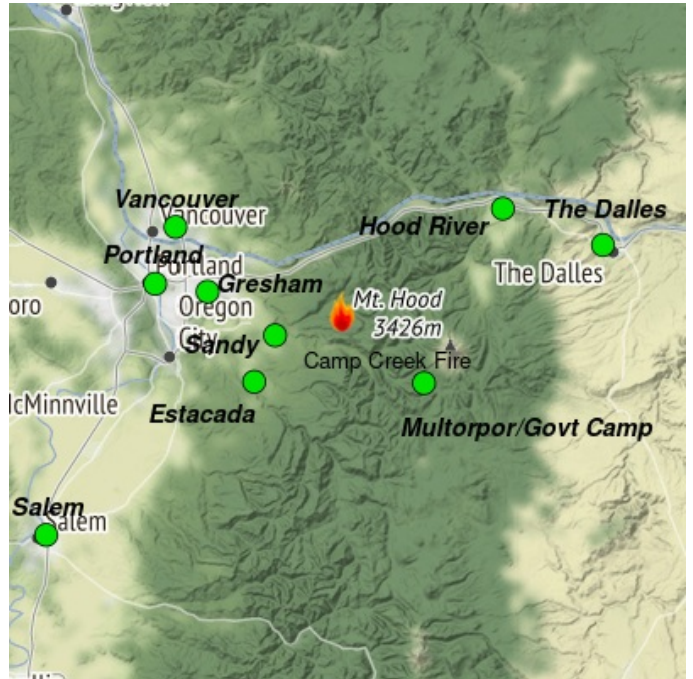
### Fire

The Camp Creek fire is reported at 1,940 acres with 16% containment. Expect a gradual increase in fire activity the next few days as continued sunshine and warmer weather lead to dryer fuel conditions.

### Smoke

Light west winds are in the extended weather forecast, which will bring light smoke eastward towards Mount Hood, Hood River, and the Dalles during the day and possibly settling at night. At night, smoke will move down-slope towards East Portland and clear out mid to late morning. Tomorrow and tomorrow night, any smoke that does impact communities will be light and impacts will be minimal, with the exception of the communities near the mouth of the Sandy River, such as Troutdale, Gresham, and Camas, which may reach Unhealthy levels in the mornings.

Air Quality Index (AQI)	Actions to Protect Yourself
Green (Good)	None
Yellow (Moderate)	Unusually sensitive individuals should consider limiting prolonged or heavy exertion.
Orange (USG)	People within Sensitive Groups* should <b>reduce</b> prolonged or heavy outdoor exertion.
Red (Unhealthy)	People within Sensitive Groups* should <b>avoid all</b> physical outdoor activity.
Purple (Very Unhealthy)	Everyone should avoid prolonged or heavy exertion.
Dark Purple (Hazardous)	Everyone should avoid any outdoor activity.
