Fire


The Lookout Fire is 24,575 acres with an increase 20% containment. The Bedrock Fire is 31,590 acres with an increase to 85% containment. Latest fire information is available at InciWeb: tinyurl.com/Fire-Information

Smoke

A shift in winds is coming today. We are expected to have an easterly wind flow starting in the late morning and increasing through the day. This will lead to improving air quality in Central Oregon where most will see MODERATE air quality. But on the west side of the fire this means that air quality may degrade as the winds come in. McKenzie will see VERY UNHEALTHY air quality today. The air quality in Detroit Lake and Sweet Home will also decrease to MODERATE. Eugene has the most uncertainty as there is potential for smoke to travel down the McKenzie drainage into town. This will largely depend on how strong the easterly winds become. Eugene could see MODERATE with periods of USG as the winds push smoke into the area.
