
## Fire

The Camp Creek fire is still reported at 1,902 acres with an increase in containment to 16%. Cool, cloudy, and moist conditions have kept fire behavior minimal. Starting today, weather will start to become gradually warmer and dryer through the week into the weekend, which may lead to an increase in fire activity compared to the past couple days.

## **Smoke**

Light west winds today will send light smoke eastward, but with minimal fire activity and smoke production, smoke impacts are not expected in the outlook area. Tonight into tomorrow morning, light smoke may settle into the valleys, especially the Sandy River valley, and move towards the east side of Portland. If light smoke does make its way to East Portland tonight, it should clear out by late tomorrow morning.
