Northwest California-Interior Happy Camp Complex

Fire

Most areas of the Happy Camp Complex did receive some precipitation over the last two days Yesterday firefighters on the Elliot Fire scouted locations to build additional fire line on the west side of the fire. The fire is holding at Dillon Creek and State Route 96. Crews on the Ufish continued to improve fire lines for potential future strategic firing operations. Clear skies allowed for an aerial reconnaissance flight over the Hancock Fire to assess fire growth and activity. Due to the steep and rugged terrain, smokejumpers will fly into Creek Camp to evaluate the area and values at risk. The complex has burned approximately 27,544 acres. Smoke

Widespread rain across our forecast areas as well as those to the west and north allowed for extensive air quality improvements for most locations yesterday. Today, again should be relatively GOOD for most of our forecasted area. **As conditions return to warm/dry, prevailing winds may bring some surrounding fire smoke back into the area.**
