
Fire

The Camp Creek fire is reported at 2,021 acres with 28% containment. Crews continue to make progress containing the fire by using firing operations to secure firelines. The increase in acres is due to firing operations rather than fire spread.

Smoke

Expect similar smoke conditions today and tomorrow compared to the past several days. Smoke dispersion patterns will remain the same, with light west winds bringing light smoke eastward during the afternoon and evening, and down-slope winds bringing smoke towards East Portland at night and clearing out late morning. With cloud cover tomorrow, smoke may be more persistent and may not dissipate until early afternoon. Areas near the mouth of the Sandy River, such as Troutdale, Gresham, and Camas, may reach Unhealthy levels in the mornings.
