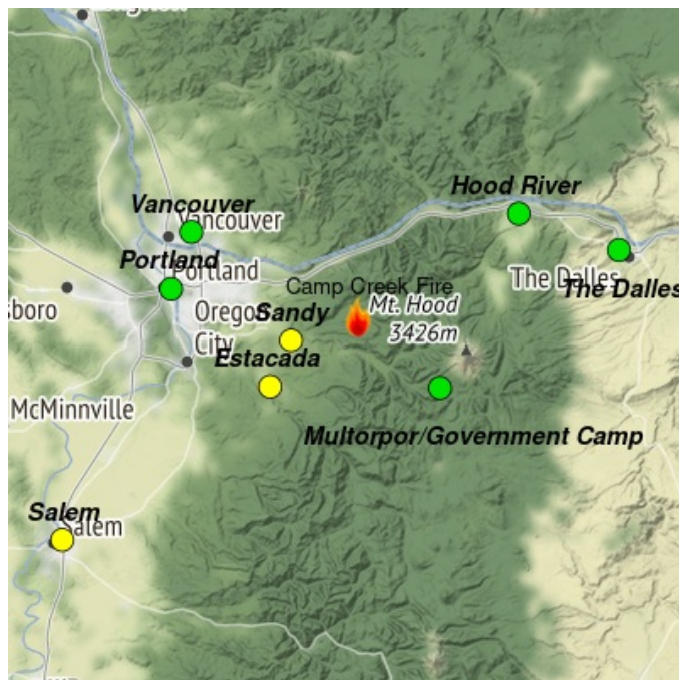
Fire

The fire area received over a half of an inch of rain yesterday, which greatly limited fire spread. However, because this fire is burning in a deep duff layer with dense canopy, rain may have not saturated the area and the fire is continuing to smolder. Over the weekend, the weather will dry out and fire behavior may increase as well. The fire continues to stay south of Forest Road 12 and north of Forest Road 14.

Smoke

Smoke again this morning may be trapped in areas due to a light inversion, this will break by mid-morning and move smoke out the forecast area. Today, winds will shift and may bring smoke southwest of the fire area and into Sandy, Estacada, South Portland and Salem. The warmer and drier weather expected today and tomorrow may lead to more visible smoke production compared to the last few days.

Air Quality Index (AQI)	Actions to Protect Yourself
● Good	None
● Moderate	Unusually sensitive individuals should consider limiting prolonged or heavy exertion.
● USG	People within Sensitive Groups* should reduce prolonged or heavy outdoor exertion.
● Unhealthy	People within Sensitive Groups* should avoid all physical outdoor activity.
● Very Unhealthy	Everyone should avoid prolonged or heavy exertion.
● Hazardous	Everyone should avoid any outdoor activity.
