
## Fire

## Minimal fire behavior with cool and damp conditions. Fires within the Smith River Complex (83,974 acres) and the Six Rivers Forest Lightning Complex (16,478 acres) will continue to creep and smolder the next two days. Minimal growth is expected through Sunday. You can find more



## **Smoke**

Wetting rain diminishes smoke levels. As the cut-off low that brought rain gradually moves away, residual smoke will be directed to the NW and then NE. Overnight, smoke will settle in the valleys, before westerly winds return on Sunday. Overall, GOOD to MODERATE air quality (AQ) is expected. Near Orleans, USG is expected due to smoldering from the nearby Pearch Fire. Smoke levels will vary across the Crescent City area, ranging from GOOD near the coast to USG/UNHEALTHY near Gasquet. A warming and drying trend begins on Monday with a gradual increase in smoke production. For the latest observations on air quality, see EPA's Fire and Smoke Map.
