9/19 - 9/20

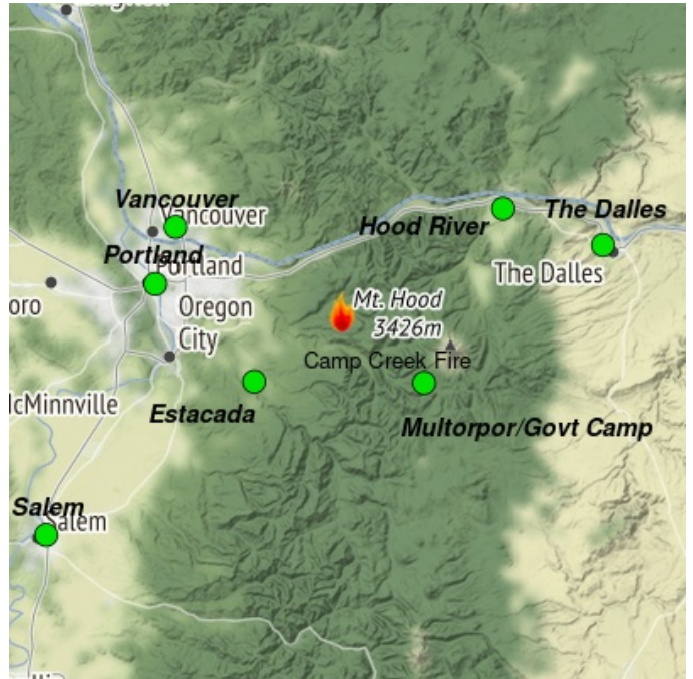
Issued by Wildland Fire Air Quality Response Program on September 19, 2023 at 08:26 AM PDT

Fire

The Camp Creek fire remains at 2,055 acres and containment has increased to 54%. Few areas of intense heat remain. Fire behavior is limited to interior clean up, creeping, smoldering, and isolated flare ups. Heavy fuels will continue to consume and burn out. A cold front moves through on Wednesday morning, bringing rainfall and further diminishing fire activity.

Smoke

Cooler conditions have damped fire behavior and additional growth is not expected. New smoke production is not forecast, limiting smoky conditions to within the fire perimeter and the immediate vicinity of the Bull Run watershed. Residual smoke from smoldering will continue until a cold front pushes through on Wednesday morning. Rainfall will scrub remaining smoke and will clear out any low-lying areas where smoky condition persisted earlier this week. Disperse smoke from regional fires may influence the northeastern part of the forecast area until the weather system passes through on Wednesday. Overall, the forecast area will remain in GOOD conditions until late week.
