Depending on favorable weather conditions, ignitions are planned: Prescribed fire window, October 20th-29th, 2023 Actual ignitions will only be a couple of days

Why Are We Burning?

The goal of this prescribed burn is to reduce the existing fire hazard, enhance wildlife habitat, and reintroduce fire into a fire-dependent ecosystem.

Why Now?

Fall, winter, and spring bring cooler temperatures and precipitation, which favor prescribed burning. Each prescribed fire operation follows a prescribed fire burn plan, which considers temperature, humidity, wind, moisture of the vegetation, and conditions for the dispersal of smoke. This information is used to decide when and where to burn. We give as much advance notice as possible before burning, but some operations may be conducted on short notice.

Smoke

Smoke from prescribed fire operations is normal and may continue for several days after an ignition depending on the project size and environmental conditions. Smoke typically settles into the valleys in the evening and lifts in the morning. We coordinate with state and local county air pollution control districts and monitor weather conditions closely prior to prescribed fire ignition. Crews also conduct test burns before igniting a larger area, to verify how effectively fuels are consumed and how smoke will travel.
