### **Smoke**


Widespread smoke from the McDonald fire, the Globe Fire (and adjacent Slate and Iver Fires), fires in the eastern part of the state, and smoke from Canada is impacting the region. Air quality is ranging from USG to HAZARDOUS around the Fairbanks area this morning. A wind shift to the west today should bring some relief to the population center and Nenana. However, communities to the east and southeast may see a significant decrease in air quality as smoke is pushed that way. Smoke will continue to impact the Richardson Highway. For the weekend, be prepared for smoke to settle across the Interior as winds decrease.

Pay attention to changing conditions. Use periods of better air to get outside and open up windows. Take care to protect yourself from prolonged periods of smoke.

## Visibility

Areas experiencing 'Unhealthy' air quality will see visibility in the 1 to 3-mile range. In areas of heavier smoke very close to the fires, visibility may be reduced to less than 1 mile.
