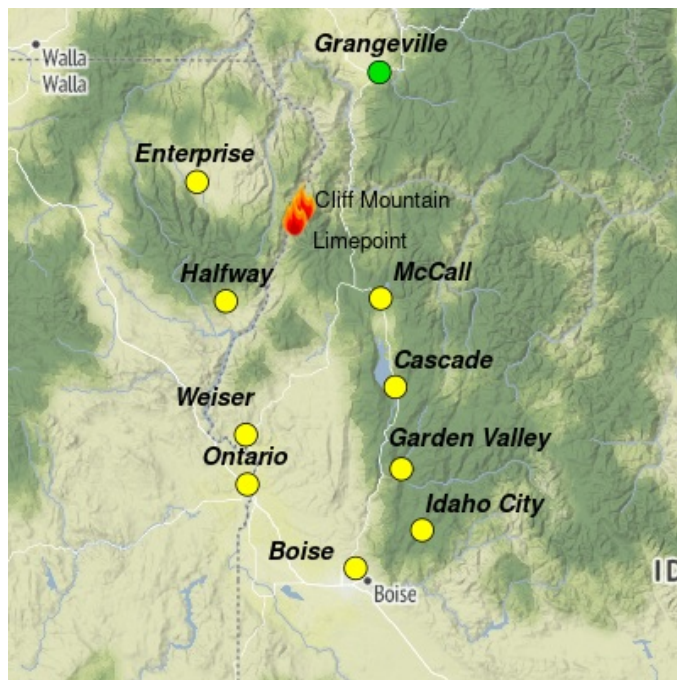

Fire

Smoke

High pressure today will bring hotter and drier weather starting Wednesday and peaking Friday. Today's conditions should be more favorable from previous days resulting in MODERATE air quality across the area. Transport smoke from Oregon and California fires should remain aloft, only resulting in upper atmospheric hazy conditions. Smoke from the Limepoint/Cliff Mountain fires will be terrain-driven in the early hours flowing SW downslope through the Snake River corridor. Late morning conditions will begin to move smoke primarily NE toward Grangeville then eventually drift E-SE in the later afternoon possibly impacting air quality in McCall and Cascades.
