Special Statement

The Washington Dept of Ecology has issued an Air Quality Advisory for much of the Smoke Outlook area.

Fire


The Pioneer Fire is reported at 18,731 acres with 2974 acres of growth occurring in the past 24 hours. It was very active yesterday in the Fish Creek drainage. Approaching an area with abundant biomass, expect fire behavior today to include areas of sustained head fire runs, spotting, aggressive flanking, and backing (with rollout). Very active fire behavior is likely for the next several days.

Smoke

Yesterday, an impressive column of smoke was produced with pyrocumulus clearly observed on satellite. Much of it lofted over the Outlook Area. However, early this morning, much of the lower Methow Valley reported USG and UNHEALTHY air quality. Influenced by valley flow and WNW winds aloft, much of region today will see reduced air quality. UNHEALTHY for SENSITIVE GROUPS (USG) expected at times for most sites south of the fire. Winthrop and Stehekin - today - may remain GOOD on average. However, southerly winds on Tuesday, should result in USG across nearly all of the Methow and Lake Chelan Valleys.
