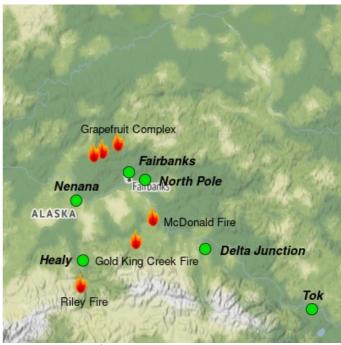
## Fire

## Smoke

The cool, wet weather significantly moderated fire behavior and smoke production. There is still some lingering smoke in the eastern Tanana River valley toward Canada, which will likely clear today. It will be a bit drier and windier today, but the overall pattern will stay cool and wet through the weekend and into next week. With the suppressed smoke production, the air quality is expected to remain GOOD.

Looking ahead, due to the number of fires across the landscape, smoldering fires and shifting winds may result in localized smoke impacts. Use the Fire and Smoke Map for current air quality information. Pay attention to changing conditions and take action to protect yourself if warranted.
