Wildfire Preparedness: Always be Ready

August 29, 2024, Jackson, Wyo. – The <u>Fish Creek Fire</u> is burning on the Bridger-Teton National Forest and has prompted our neighbors in Fremont County to put several areas in a pre-evacuation stage. Though no protective actions have been ordered in Teton County, smoke is in the air which is always a good reminder to make sure that you are READY.

Being READY means being prepared in advance of a disaster or emergency. Don't wait for someone to tell you – you should be ready year-round for hazards that are likely in our community. Take time today to make sure you have completed the steps below.
