
#### Fire

The Boise Fire is 12,907 acres and 43 percent contained. Very little smoke was observed from the fire yesterday as fire activity remained minimal. As hot and dry weather continues to build this week, isolated to scattered heat (e.g. large previously burned logs, snags, and stump holes) within the interior will likely begin producing some limited smoke.


#### Smoke

**GOOD** air quality, overall, is expected to continue for the outlook area through at least Wednesday. New smoke production is expected to remain minimal. Haze should become more noticeable especially near and to the east of the fire's perimeter. As high pressure aloft strengthens through Friday, inversions will last longer into the afternoon resulting in much more stagnant air. As a result, **MODERATE** air quality may expand to more locations
