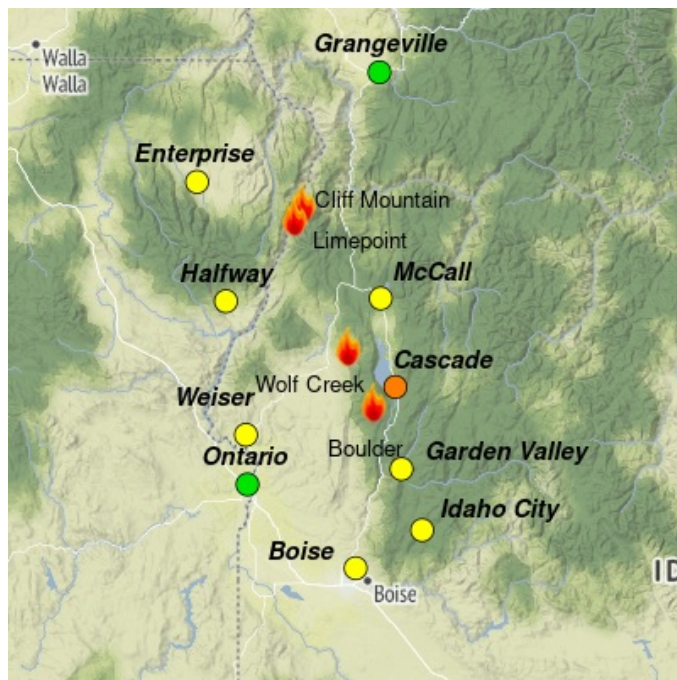

Fire

The Limepoint fire grew 690 acres and now stands at 25,295 acres burned with 5% containment. Smoke

Terrain-driven smoke will follow SW down the Snake River Corridor this morning then shift to a more southwesterly flow pushing smoke to the northeast. Riggins could experience lightly impaired air today (MODERATE) dependent on fire activity on the Limepoint fire. Clearer conditions should persist throughout the Outlook area with any added smoke possible from Oregon fires to the west and southwest. The Boulder fire grew only 86 acres yesterday yet the Cascade community continues to see elevated AQI. However, today Cascade could see mostly MODERATE for the first time in days as smoke continues to ventilate and transport out of this area. GOOD conditions should be prevalent in Halfway and Ontario, OR.
