Containment reaches 100% on Dixon Fire

DAYS CREEK, Ore. – By meeting the mop up standard set by local agencies, the Oregon Department of Forestry Incident Management Team 2 (ODF IMT 2) will transfer command of the Dixon Fire to a local Type 4 organization. The local Type 4 organization, led by Incident Commander Tray Babikoff, is comprised of local resources from the Umpqua National Forest and Douglas Forest Protective Association.

The Dixon fire has reached 100% containment. “This positive outcome is due to partnerships. The fire burned across a checkerboard of private and government ownerships, says Matt Howard, Incident Commander of ODF IMT 2. “Everybody was in lockstep to bring together the right resources and support effective decision-making.”

The Dixon Fire Information phone and email services will no longer be staffed, and the Dixon InciWeb site is now inactive.

Road Update: The Tiller Trail Highway is open. Take precaution as firefighters continue to work in the area and rolling debris and other post-fire hazards remain along the Tiller Trail Highway.

Evacuation levels: No evacuation levels are in place.

Public Use Restrictions:

Douglas Forest Protective Association fire restrictions are set to MODERATE and LEVEL 2. Restrictions on open burning remain in effect.

Public use restrictions for the Umpqua National Forest are at Very High and Level 3.
