Firefighters using drones to identify hot spots near fireline

COTTAGE GROVE, Ore. – Mop-up continues to be the focus for firefighters on the Cottage Grove – Lane 1 Fire. The use of handheld infrared cameras and unmanned aircraft systems (UAS) equipped with infrared cameras has helped firefighters identify fire burning below the surface. Once located, firefighters dig up these hotspots and use water to cool the heat and douse the flames.

Fire behavior remains minimal as fuels are still wet from the inch of rain accumulated during Saturday's thunderstorms. Today fuels will dry as the relative humidity reduces and temperatures warm. This will make areas of heat more visible for firefighters. The fire has reached 68% containment.

Water bars are being placed on control lines across the fire on steep slopes to slow and divert water, limiting erosion. This work is being prioritized with the possibility of more rain in the forecast.

Resources are being released from the fire to be available for other incidents and to return home for rest.

Night shift resources have shifted to a patrol status across the fire, monitoring for smoke and flames near the perimeter.

Closures: Due to the wildfires, the Umpqua National Forest has issued two closures impacting every district of the forest. Cottage Grove Ranger District is closed. Closure Orders and maps can be found here: <u>https://www.fs.usda.gov/alerts/umpqua/alerts-notices</u>.

Joe Hessel Incident Management Team 1 **Evacuations:** A "Level 3" evacuation notice is in effect for the Bohemia Mining District and Fairview Peak. An evacuation map is available at: <u>www.LaneCountyOR.gov/Lane1Fire</u>.

Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR): A "TFR" is in place at an altitude from the surface up to and including 8500 feet, daily (24 hours) until further notice.
