Fire

Decreased fire activity is expected today on the pre-existing large fires in the area as compared to the last couple of days due the rainfall received yesterday through early this morning. However, some drying is expected this afternoon, enough that some lightning holdovers could pop in areas that got lightning, but little to no rainfall, from southeastern Yakima County southeastward. The Retreat Fire 14 miles WSW of Naches is 45,601 acres and 85% contained, the Williams Mine Fire on the SW side of Mt Adams is 11,555 acres and 5% contained. Smoke

Mostly GOOD air quality is likely today and Monday due to diminished fire activity as a result of the significant wetting rainfall on the large fires in the area west of Yakima. However, there is a possibility that new lightning fires could pop up today in areas that received lightning, but little to no rainfall bringing some smoke to southeastern portion of the area. The Williams Mine fire could bring some light smoke impacts to SW portions of the area at times in the afternoons to evenings as conditions dry out later this week.
