Fire

Warmer and drier weather may increase fire activity and smoke production. Fire crews continue working on fire line construction, patrolling, mop up of hotspots, and other suppression activities. The latest fire information is at Inciweb's Wildfire Information.

Smoke

Areas immediately adjacent to active fires may see some smoke. Overall, impacts should be minimal and localized. Air quality may decline as the warm/dry spell continues.

Moderate	Unusually sensitive individuals should consider limiting prolonged or heavy exertion.		
USG	People within Sensitive Groups* should reduce prolonged or heavy outdoor exertion.		
Unhealthy	People within Sensitive Groups* should avoid all physical outdoor activity.		
Very Unhealthy	Everyone should avoid prolonged or heavy exertion.		
Hazardous	Everyone should avoid any outdoor activity.
