

Fire


Fire activity today is expected to be high with hot, dry and windy conditions. The Limepoint Fire grew somewhat yesterday as did other fires near Cascade. Containment which has been gowing my drop across active fires in the forecast area. Smoke

Smoke production is expected to be heavy today, with large columns possible, especially in the afternoon. However, winds should push much of today's smoke northeast of the Highway 55 corridor. Overnight, cool temperatures and low winds will likely cause smoke from smoldering fires to settle into valleys. The West Mountain Fire Complex and Middle Fork Fire Complex are the primary sources of smoke. Regions west of the U.S. Route 95 corridor should continue to experience MODERATE air quality. Fires to the north and east of Grangeville will contribute additional smoke to the region, impacting the town overnight.
