## Special Statement


An air quality alert has been issued for our monitoring area through the weekend.

## Fire


Yesterday, clouds and smoke kept fire growth minimal - we are not reporting any change to acreage or containment this morning. Clouds and smoke are expected to lift today by midday which may make the fires on the Willamette more active. Burnout operations may occur if conditions align for the crews on the ground.

## Smoke

Yesterday saw air quality in the Good to Moderate range throughout the area except for high concentrations of smoke near Oakridge due to continued active fires and the strong inversion. Today, conditions should see some improvement by late afternoon for Oakridge when the inversion breaks. At the other sites towards the south and east, we expect minimal smoke impacts this morning and afternoon, but smoke from active fires could drift into communities into the late afternoon and evening.
