Fire

The forecast area continues a warming and drying period, maintaining light smoke production. Smoke will primarily be from smoldering and creeping fire; however, this will likely temper with precipitation into the evening and into Monday. More information can be found at West Mountain Fires Inciweb.

Smoke

Smoke in Cascade remains stubborn, with the area maintaining MODERATE air quality for the day along with McCall. Donnelly will be the outlier and observe GOOD air quality today with potential periods of MODERATE. Areas local to the fire may observe periods of **USG**. Thunderstorms in the evening should bring GOOD air quality to Long Valley for the next several days.
