

# **Horseshoe Fire Update**

### **Current Situation:**

Thanks to the great work of firefighters and recent precipitation in the area, the Horseshoe Fire is now at 95% containment and has stayed within its current footprint.

Rocks and boulders have fallen onto Horseshoe Meadow Road along with snow, so firefighters will not be able to work safely past Carroll Creek area. However, they will still patrol as far up the road as they can and engage whenever possible. They will also stage resources along Lubken Canyon Road while Inyo County road crews remove hazards from the roadways when possible.

Heavy equipment has arrived to engage in suppression line repair wherever possible, but likely won't be at this time due to the rain and snow activity.

Evacuation orders and warnings remain unchanged.
