Situation:

Crews continue to monitor and improve the western flank of the fire by masticating fuels in Monroe Canyon and around Signal Peak. The Water Canyon and Rock Canyon areas continue to be monitored, and a helicopter was used to moderate fire activity in those areas. Crews continue to work hotspots in Second Hand Left Fork and near Glenwood Mountain.

A presence is being maintained in Burrville and along the eastern flank of the fire as resources continue to hold and mop up. Crews are continuing to stitch together the containment line and tying in with the existing line along Hwy 24.

Mop-up operations will continue along the southern edge of the fire as crews clean up following burn operations. Crews will continue to maintain a presence in the Magleby and Manning Meadows communities, providing structure protection.

Weather:

Hot, dry and breezy conditions will persist over the fire area. A high-pressure system is building, which will produce northwest winds that could produce gusts of up to 20 mph. The combination of hot weather and light winds will create critical fuel conditions. A fire and fuels behavior advisory is in effect due to critically dry fuel moisture. Active fire behavior is expected throughout the day due to weather and steep topography.
