**Situation:** The western edge of the fire continues to see progress as crews work to build containment line around Marysvale Peak. Late yesterday afternoon there was a 30-acre slop over that crews were able to get around and tied in with existing containment line. A handcrew was inserted along the western edge and continues to work south from Anderson Canyon along the fire perimeter. Work continued around Glenwood Peak as crews worked hotspots and tied into existing line. Along the southern edge, fire crews continue to hold and patrol the area while cleaning up from a burn operation that took place on Saturday. Improvements to the line are being made with handcrews and dozers working towards Marysvale Peak. Crews continue to work in the Long Flat, Magleby, Manning Meadows, Monroe Meadows and Elk Country to patrol and mop up around structures and extinguish residual heat in those areas.

**Weather:** Hot and dry conditions will continue with temperatures predicted to stay in the high 80s and low 90s. A Fuel and Fire Behavior Advisory is in place due to critically dry fuels. Winds will continue to gust between 20-25 mph. Later this week a bit of cloud cover is expected which will reduce the fire behavior that has been experienced in the fire area. Thursday and Friday the forecast shows a chance of thunderstorms that could bring dry lightning on Thursday with a chance of moisture mixed in on Friday.
